INTRODUCTION OF WEL:

Water Environment and Life Organisation (WEL) is a Non-Governmental Organisation (NGO) registered with the Government of Nepal. It was registered with the District Administration Office in Lalitpur on September 17, 1997, under the NGO Registration Act of 1977. WEL's registration number is 837-054/055, and it is affiliated with the Social Welfare Council, reference number 6790.

WEL has received approval to operate as a district-based local NGO in the Morang and Sunsari districts of Koshi Province, as well as

the Saptari District of Madhesh Province. As a non-profit organization, WEL focuses on Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH), Total Sanitation, and other community development activities. The organization comprises professionals in engineering, WASH, community development, social mobilization, and other development sectors.

VISION:

WEL believes in the principle that "Development is a dynamic process." Every activity undertaken in development work

should be sustainable and resilient, with a focus on benefiting future generations. Priority is given to locally initiated, community-based development programs, utilizing local resources and indigenous technology for effective goal achievement.

Mission:

WEL's primary mission is to conduct research, development work, and implement various development programs linked with Disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) and Disaster Risk Management (DRM). These efforts aim to provide improved WASH, a healthier environment, and better health for both present and future generations.

OBJECTIVES:

To achieve its mission, WEL has the following objectives:

- 1. Raise awareness about environmental pollution, its effects, and solutions.
- Increase awareness of WASH and provide information on mitigating communicable diseases.
- Conduct studies and research on water supply and sanitation, water quality monitoring, wastewater, solid waste, bioengineering, and environmental impacts.
- 4. Provide technical support for water source conservation and educate on protecting these sources.
- 5. Promote sustainable development programs.
- 6. Conduct training related to infrastructure construction.
- 7. Implement programs to reduce gender inequality.
- 8. Collaborate with national and international organizations with similar goals.

SCOPE OF WORK & GEOGRAPHICAL AREA COVERAGE

WEL is a national-level NGO founded by experts in environment, water and sanitation, health, and social activities, focusing on community development. The organization

prioritizes community participation and capacity building through awareness programs.

Since its inception, WEL has established itself as a reputable institution for providing technical support, monitoring, and construction supervision of physical infrastructure and related activities (training, orientation, etc.) in development projects related to WASH, environmental protection, bioengineering, health education, community infrastructure. WEL operates both during normal times and emergencies. Initially focused on Provinces 1 and 2, WEL is expanding its programs nationwide and has partnered with numerous national and international organizations and UN agencies such as UNICEF, UNDP/UN OCHA, WVIN, Oxfam, RPMO/ADB, DWSS, WSSDO, ENPHO, TEAM-NEPAL, SEAM-N, RWSSFDB, and more.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT & CONTROL ARRANGEMENT

WEL conducts its financial transactions in accordance with its constitution and ensures audits of program and financial documents according to existing organizational policies and guidelines, as well as instructions from the Executive Management Committee.

MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

A management team led by the Executive Director oversees the organization and its programs. WEL has qualified and experienced human resources and can hire additional professionals as needed for short-term projects. The permanent staff includes an Executive Director, a Finance/Admin Officer, and an Office Assistant, ensuring the organization's continued operation even without active programs.

EXISTENCE OF TRANSPARENCY

WEL is a fully transparent NGO. According to its constitution, WEL holds an annual General

Assembly (GA) where all board and general members participate and endorse decisions made by the Executive Committee (Board). The Board meets monthly and selects a registered auditing firm or individual for yearly financial audits. The GA also democratically elects Management Committee members every two years, who in turn elect the Chairperson, Vice-chairperson, General Secretary, and Treasurer. The Management

Committee, under the chairperson's guidance, monitors WEL programs and provides policy-level guidance.
